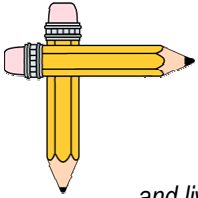

From the Pastor's Pencil

Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, his body, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near to God with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold unwaveringly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.
(Hebrews 10:19-25)

One of the things the Friedlund family enjoys doing together is going to a restaurant, squeezing into a round corner booth and spending a couple of hours over a good meal. Although our appetite for a particular cuisine brings us to that restaurant, it is our hunger for the love and fellowship of family that keeps us there long after the plates have been taken. It's fun to laugh together and remember events of years-gone-by as well as to listen to the plans and dreams we have for the future. As much as I would like for things to be the way they used to be, our family is changing. 4. We should not give up meeting together.
5. We should make it a priority to encourage one another—and all the more as we see the day approaching.

Can you see the healthy cycle here? As we come near to God with a sincere heart through prayer and meditation upon His Word, and as we hold on to the great hope in Christ that is ours through faith, we will naturally want to encourage fellow Christians to do the same; to live out the Gospel through a demonstration of love and good deeds toward the world. Thus, we meet together for worship, instruction and fellowship. The result is that we "draw near to God" and the cycle starts fresh again.

This is the great purpose of the church; to help Christians stay in a healthy cycle of maintaining spiritual vitality. My passion for Trinity Church will be to foster all of these elements of spiritual health through the various ministries that we carry out. As we begin a new season of ministry together, I want to encourage you to celebrate your faith in Jesus Christ by practicing these five Congregational disciplines. Jump into a healthy cycle of spiritual life and lead others to do the same along with you.

Trinity! When you're here, you're family!

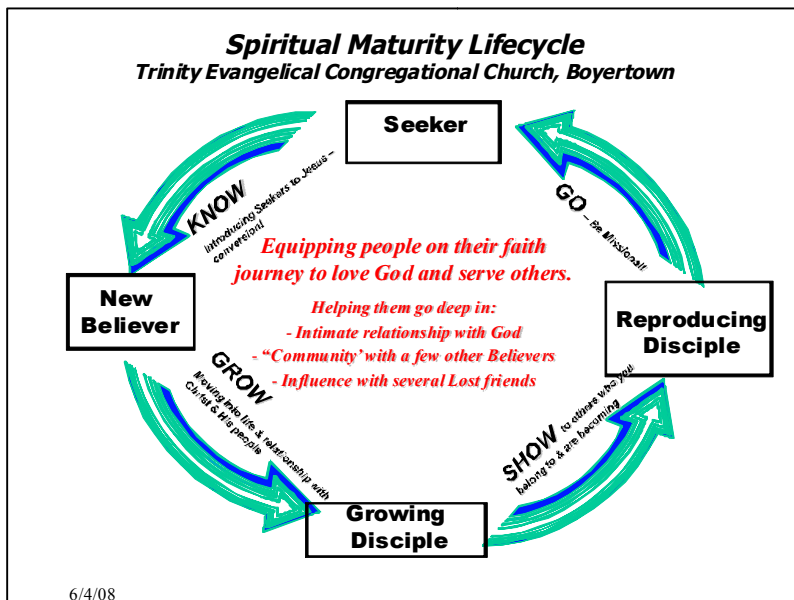
LIFE – TO – LIFE Vision for Trinity EC Church

Trinity's desire to become a Disciple-making church is rooted in Jesus Great Commission. Jesus wants us to be His disciple and it is Jesus desire & design for His followers to MAKE (more) DISCIPLES. Although all churches pursue this Commission in one way or another, this desire and vision was intentionally initiated by our former Senior Pastor, Kevin Leibensperger. Along with the Lay Leadership of our church, we invited the Navigators Ministry to assist us in becoming an Intentionally Disciple-making Church. Don Graybill entered into a consulting agreement with us, guiding us to assemble a Discipleship Task Force that would evaluate Trinity and then begin planning ways to lead us toward this goal.

In May 2007, Trinity hosted a DISCIPLING OTHERS SEMINAR. As a result of being exposed to the challenge of Discipleship Relationships, Triads were formed among those who felt God's Spirit calling them to grow.

Also, that Spring, Pastor Al was asked by Pastor Kevin and the Ministry Council, to lead the Discipleship Task Force (DTF) and this group began meeting with Navigators Consultant, Don Graybill in June 2007. This was an intentional selection to entrust this ministry with Pastor Al, knowing that Pastor Kevin had been nominated to become the E.C.C. Bishop and, that Trinity needed to continue moving this direction, regardless of who was our Lead Pastor. Now that Pastor John will begin at Trinity this month, he has been briefed on our Disciplemaking ministry and is in full support of our direction.

One of the practical outcomes of the DTF was the formation of Life-To-Life (L2L) Groups. Currently there are about 100 members and friends of Trinity involved in a discipleship L2L group. And, 4 groups have already multiplied, birthing more groups in a second generation.



We are now at a point where we want to encourage the growth of our Intentional Discipleship ministry in two ways. (1) For existing groups to invite persons (SEEKERS) from their surrounding community to join them in a L2L study. These might be unchurched friends, pre-Christians, or unconnected believers. (2) For leadership to invite Trinity members and friends who have not experienced an intentional discipleship relationship into a L2L group to grow into a Reproducing Disciple.



Our desire, as an Intentionally Disciple-making Church, is for Trinity to be a place where a majority of our worshipers are actively pursuing the 3 CORE

RELATIONSHIPS in a growing, grace-filled environment. Join us as we (1) GET CLOSER TO CHRIST, (2) GET CLOSER TO A FEW OTHER BELIEVERS, and (3) INTENTIONALLY GO OUT OF OUR COMFORT ZONE TO REACH & FORM RELATIONSHIPS WITH PRE-CHRISTIANS!

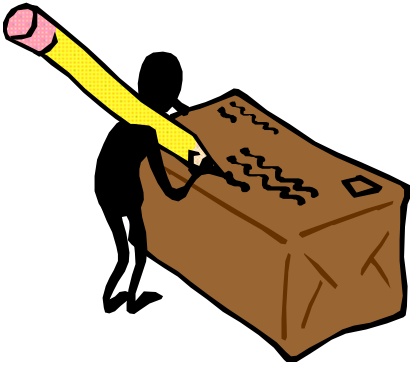

Trinity – A Missional place!

-- Pursuing Core Relationship # 3 --



Staying Healthy with Your Health Ministry“And don’t forget to wash your hands!” called out Mom from the kitchen. Yep Mom was plenty smart and we still need to heed those words, especially today and it started way back when. Did you know:

The name *Lavabo* ("I shall wash") is derived from the words of [Psalm 26:6-12 \(KJV\)](#)—in the [Septuagint](#) it is Psalm 25), which the [celebrant](#) traditionally recites while he washes his hands: "I will wash my hands in innocency, so will I compass thine altar, O Lord". The washing of hands during the recitation of these psalm verses is of very ancient usage in the Christian church.

On June 11, 2009, the [World Health Organization](#) (WHO) raised the worldwide pandemic alert level to [Phase 6](#) in response to the ongoing global spread of the novel influenza A (H1N1) virus. A Phase 6 designation indicates that a global pandemic is underway.

More than 70 countries are now reporting cases of human infection with novel H1N1 flu. This number has been increasing over the past few weeks, but many of the cases reportedly had links to travel or were localized outbreaks without community spread. The WHO designation of a pandemic alert Phase 6 reflects the fact that there are now ongoing community level outbreaks in multiple parts of world. Pennsylvania now has 626 cases.

WHO’s decision to raise the pandemic alert level to Phase 6 is a reflection of the spread of the virus, NOT the severity of illness caused by the virus. It’s uncertain at this time how serious or severe this novel H1N1 pandemic will be in terms of how many people infected will develop serious complications or die from novel H1N1 infection. Most deaths , 2 in PA, have occurred in chronically ill people. Experience with this virus so far is limited and influenza is unpredictable. However, because novel H1N1 is a new virus, many people may have little or no immunity against it, and illness may be more severe and widespread as a result. In addition, currently there is no vaccine to protect against novel H1N1 virus. A vaccine is not expected until the fall, at the earliest.



In the United States, most people who have become ill with the newly declared pandemic virus have recovered without requiring medical treatment, however, CDC anticipates that there will be more cases, more hospitalizations and more deaths associated with this pandemic in the coming days and weeks. In addition, this virus could cause significant illness with associated hospitalizations and deaths in the fall and winter during the U.S. influenza season. It is very important to receive your yearly flu shot and possibly two when they produce a vaccine for H1N1.

There is no need for panic: there is a NEED for education and listening to “MOM”. Wash your hands for at least 20 sec. Sing “The B-I-B-L-E” twice while washing with soap and warm water, it is the washing action (friction) that gets the “bugs” off and heading down the sink. Dry thoroughly. Wash often; especially after using the bathroom and before eating. Carry hand sanitizer for those times you can’t wash your hands. Cough into your elbow and turn your back to someone who is coughing or sneezing. The CDC is encouraging people to wear face masks and respirators if they are chronically ill and in a high flu outbreak area.

Know the signs and symptoms of the flu: fever, shakes, chills, general body aches, headache and call your doctor promptly. Oseltamivir (trade name Tamiflu®) and zanamivir (Relenza®) are two antiviral drugs shown to be effective at minimizing the symptoms – they do not “cure” the flu. Aspirin or aspirin-containing products (e.g. bismuth subsalicylate – Pepto Bismol) should not be administered to any confirmed or suspected ill case of novel influenza A (H1N1) virus infection aged 18 years old and younger due to the risk of Reye syndrome. For relief of fever, acetaminophen or non steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs are usually recommended. For more information about Reye’s syndrome, visit the [National Institute of Health website](http://www.nia.nih.gov/health/flu).

Use common sense, if you start feeling sick, stay home! Avoid others and see the doctor promptly if the symptoms continue or become worse. Remember you can pass the flu onto others. The most important tip is to wash your hands. Try to stay in good general health. **Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress (don’t forget to PRAY, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious food.** Avoid touching surfaces that may be contaminated with the flu virus. Avoid close contact with people who are sick. Go to www.cdc.gov, or www.who.org and www.flutoolbox.com for more information that is updated daily.

Now you know where the word lavatory came from and it is just as important now as it was then. Your body is a temple for the Lord, keep it healthy.

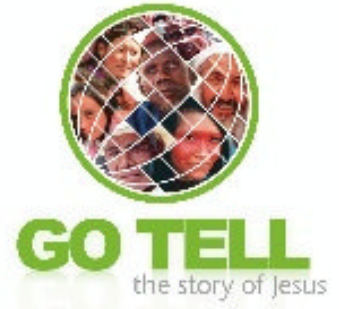

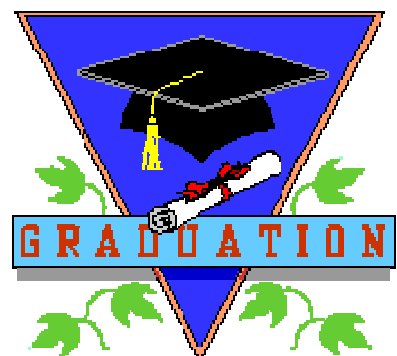
