Phillips Brooks (1835-1893) is considered by many to be one of the greatest preachers of the nineteenth century. In a message regarding the topic of Christian service, he shared the following thought;

*“God frees our souls, **not** from service, **not** from duty, but **into** service and **into** duty; and he who mistakes the purpose of his freedom mistakes the character of his freedom. He who thinks that he is being released from the work, and not set free in order that he may accomplish that work, **mistakes** the condition into which his soul is **invited to enter.**”*

These are profound statements that, as Christians, confront us with the realities of why we are here, and not in Heaven. If we still have a pulse, we must be striving toward God's purpose; Seeking FIRST His Kingdom and His righteousness.(Matt.6) We are not saved to seek after pleasure and self-interest. We are saved to embrace a righteous vision and offer ourselves in service to Jesus Christ. Staying Healthy with Your Health Ministry

Brett Favre, Phil Mickelson and Ronald Reagan all have something in common. Their wives are breast cancer survivors. MEN, keep reading this article, it's for you! October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month and a reminder to all women to be pro active with their own health. What is the male's role? To ask his loved one, mother, sister, aunt, daughter if they are having their yearly mammogram and/or doing their self examinations once a month. MEN, you could save their lives!

MEN can encourage and provide time for the women in their lives to exercise, eat healthy and have their annual physical. They can also mark the physical date on their day- planner or in their Blackberry so they will know when it is due. Make sure your loved one keeps the appointment.

MEN can also help reduce the stress in the lives of their women. A good gift any time is a spa treatment or even better yet, a day at the spa. How about doing the cooking or watching the kids so she can participate in a craft class, a special workshop, Bible Study, or a night out with "the girls".

Diets low in fat and sugar content have been shown to decrease the cancer risk in MEN and women, so don't grumble when she feeds you whole wheat pasta or more green veggies than potatoes. IF a lump is found, know that 80% of breast lumps are benign, or non cancerous. Usually these lumps are smooth, moveable and have smooth edges. Suspicious lumps are hard, uneven and feel like a hard pea or stone. MEN can encourage the woman to seek medical attention right away and go with them to the doctor visit. This is a frightening time for women so they can definitely use some MANLY support and lots of understanding.

"Fast Track" is a system utilized by most hospitals that speeds up the process for the woman once she sees her physician and he orders the appropriate tests. Everything possible is done to have the tests done ASAP and appropriate treatment started if necessary.

Richard Roundtree was the MAN who personified masculinity in the iconoclastic film *Shaft*. But he doesn't have any trouble relating to women — especially when it comes to breast cancer. In 1993 Roundtree discovered a lump in his right breast. Although less than 1% of men will be diagnosed with breast cancer it is important that MEN also do self examinations. MEN, breast cancer isn't just for women; you play a vital part not only in your health but in the health of the women closest to you. It's a MANLY thing to do.

So continue to be MANLY and show your support by wearing PINK to Trinity on Sunday, October 25. Tell your MANLY friends to come and join us in honoring and remembering all those affected by cancer with our Ribbons of Prayer and a special prayer offered at each service. Let's be MANLY like the PINK (Green) Bay Packers and wear PINK in October.

H1N1 UPDATE: Here is the latest on the former "swine flu". A vaccine has been developed but will NOT be available until at least October. It will also be in short supply in the beginning. It is not certain yet if one or two shots, given three weeks apart, will be

necessary OR who will receive the vaccine shipments. The H1N1 is unique in that it can survive in warm temperatures and is expected to start peaking once schools are in session. PLEASE wash your hands often, cough into your elbow, drink plenty of water and get plenty of rest. Symptoms are a high fever 102 or more, a cough, feeling achy, vomiting and diarrhea. Go to the doctor immediately to receive an anti viral drug and stay home until the fever has been normal for 24 hours. Use sanitizer on your hands when no soap and water is available. Remember it is the scrubbing action that gets rid of the germs.

H1N1 Vaccination Recommendations by the CDC

With the new H1N1 virus continuing to cause illness, hospitalizations and deaths in the US during the normally flu-free summer months and some uncertainty and about what the upcoming flu season might bring, CDC's, Center for Disease Control, Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices has taken an important step in preparations for a voluntary novel H1N1 vaccination effort to counter a possibly severe upcoming flu season. On July 29, ACIP met to consider who should receive novel H1N1 vaccine when it becomes available.

- **pregnant women,**
- **people who live with or care for children younger than 6 months of age,**
- **health care and emergency medical services personnel with direct patient contact,**
- **children 6 months through 4 years of age, and**
- **children 5 through 18 years of age who have chronic medical conditions.**

The committee recognized the need to assess supply and demand issues at the local level. The committee further recommended that once the demand for vaccine for these prioritized groups has been met at the local level, programs and providers should begin vaccinating everyone from ages 25 through 64 years. Current studies indicate the risk for infection among persons age 65 or older is less than the risk for younger age groups. Therefore, as vaccine supply and demand for vaccine among younger age groups is being met, programs and providers should offer vaccination to people over the age of 65.

The committee also stressed that people over the age of 65 receive the seasonal vaccine as soon as it is available. Even if novel H1N1 vaccine is initially only available in limited quantities, supply and availability will continue, so the committee stressed that programs and providers continue to vaccinate unimmunized patients and not keep vaccine in reserve for later administration of the second dose.

The novel H1N1 vaccine is not intended to replace the seasonal flu vaccine. It is intended to be used alongside seasonal flu vaccine to protect people. Seasonal flu and novel H1N1 vaccines may be administered on the same day. Trinity is hopeful to have a Flu vaccination clinic this year. Check the bulletin board for updates. I am available for questions.

Our Missionaries Write



ROOF, DAVID, CONCE, ANDREW, Brazil: “When we came to Brazil, everything is from scratch. There was no ready-to-move-in house, no presence of missionaries, no ready to use church building, a few *ready to go* outreach ministries and no church calendar planned for our past year. In faith we simply allow the Lord to help us as a family adapt to a new ministry and environment. Each day that passes we realize that we have the privilege of establishing the foundation and precedent that will carry this church forward for years to come. Come what may, we press forward to the goal of establishing a strong Missionary Church in Northern Brazil. Our congregation has been affiliated with the Missionary Church in Northern Brazil (OMS’ church in Brazil) in November 2008. Health wise, Conce continues to get good reports from her oncologist. He has her undergoing a regiment of exams to insure cancer is not reappearing in any way, shape, or form. David is busy doing what he loves to do, construct, teach, preach, and just be amazed at watching the Lord bring it all together.”

KEN SEARS, Ukraine: The church in which he is working is in the process of buying and moving into a more useful building to improve ministry in this community. However, there is a significant financial obligation in purchasing the building with much remodeling needed. Ken asks for our prayers on behalf of the church and the many decisions needed to their advantage of a serviceable building and a complete ministry for the Lord. As he says, the people there don’t think the American way, to plan ahead, but rather, they start a project and after underway, work out details. He asks our prayers for that ministry and the Lord’s blessing.

KATHRYN (KITTY) MILLER, WYCLIFFE BIBLE TRANSLATORS, Chiang Mai, Thailand: “First I must tell you my car had been stalling for me and the mechanic checked and said that a sparkplug wasn’t connected. I asked how that could happen and he said he didn’t know. I reminded him he was the last to work on the car. He just smiled! (I thought that only happens in America.) She asks for prayer that her car, with 125,000 miles) will continue to be reliable. Kitty also asks for prayer that she remain alert in driving, especially with all the motorcycles on the road. Health wise she says she walks 30 minutes a day five days a week, which helps her feel better and how much she gets done. She requests prayer for good use of her time: a healthy balance in these areas, spiritual, mental and physical. Also asks for God honoring interactions with her Buddhist, Muslim and Christian colleagues. She also asks for her learning of the Thai language. She has a housekeeper several days a week who knows no English, so this gives Kitty informal learning practice.

JOHN & CAROLYN MILLER, WYCLIFFE BIBLE TRANSLATORS, America: Because of the nature of their ministry, their home address is used. Their latest letter, dated 8/6/2009, came from Bangkok, but they will be going to the northeast shortly to work with translators from the Tang language. We need wisdom to know how to help meet the needs of the various dialects of the language. Good news recently received was that the BRU New Testament with Psalms was printed and ready to send out. The people are desperate to receive a copy as soon as possible. Pray for the Millers in their ministry and in all the traveling involved.

ART & MARY ELLEN DAVIS, AIM, Pokot Area, Kenya, “It is encouraging the way the Lord guides and meets our needs. On drilling one new borehole (well) the drill hammer got stuck in the hole which was discouraging because we had not gotten enough water to supply the needs of the people. A Mennonite missionary came by to see our operation, but we told him our hammer was stuck and a new one ordered. He loaned us his hammer, but it needed an adapter, so our operator was able to get one made and we could continue drilling.” Art went on telling how God answered prayers by sending several Bible teachers to do seminars for remote area pastors and evangelists. They see God’s hand at work in so many ways. “KEEP PRAYING for the spiritual water of everlasting life to the people of Pokot and in Kenya as we continue serving along with many others in this ‘open to the gospel’ country.”

MATEO, MAI LOU & JONATHAN GARCIA, COMMISSION TO EVERY NATION, Mexico: It is amazing how opportunities come to share our faith. I was buying a flower pot for a rose I bought when the owner asked me what I believe. I shared with him that salvation is through faith in Jesus Christ. In October, I began teaching an older Catholic woman the book of Revelation. She expressed real interest and we started a Bible study on Wednesdays. Pray for two small children whose hearts are very open to spiritual things. They find comfort in the Bible, though neither can read it because of their ages. Pray they will put their trust in Christ as their Savior.

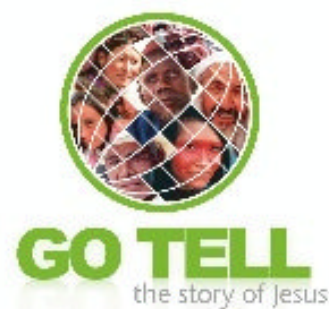

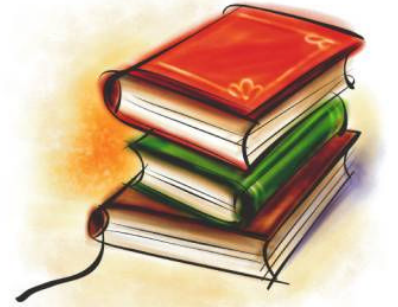

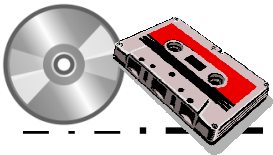
News from the Library . . .

Here is a list of frequently asked questions regarding the library.

- Do I have to be a member to check out an item from the library?
No, the library is open to everyone.
- Is there a limit to the number of items I can check out?
No, but please follow checkout rules.
- How do I check out a book? Fill out your full name and the current date (including year) on the check out card. Using the initial of the author's last name, file the card in the box after that letter. Videos and DVD's can be filed under V.
- How do I check out a tape or CD? On the check out table is a blue binder which lists each CD and tape. Find the one you wish to check out and sign your name to it.
- How long can I keep an item? We ask that you return items within two weeks – to the box under the table marked “returned books”. Renew if necessary or contact the librarian if you require a longer period of time.
- I donated a book. Why don't I see it on the shelf? Not all donated items are shelved. For various reasons some are given to a used bookstore, that gives the library a store credit. If it is your wish that an item not be given to the used bookstore but returned, write your name and phone number on the inside cover.
